Highlights

New Location

Serenity House now has an established office which is effectively helping our neighbors in Kane County. Held here are initial treatment assessments, and individual and group meetings.

Maple the Dog

Our furry friend Maple has been a delightful addition to the team. She helps provide soothing therapy and brings joy to our clients and staff day in and out.

Recovery Coaches

We have added 3 new certified recovery specialists to expand our level of personalized therapy for our clientele.

Wellness Center Addition

After an exciting campaign run in coordination with executive board member Jean Ragalie-Carr, who raised over \$36,000, we are thrilled to be constructing a gym which will be part of a larger Wellness Center to come. Here, clients can strengthen themselves mentally and physically.

Cost-effective Treatment

Our treatment cost for potential clients pales in comparison to those by the criminal justice and health systems, which differ in addressing opioid use disorders and other substance abuse, mental health, and social issues. Our long-term partnership with the drug court systems of DuPage, Kane, Will, and collar counties has helped us deliver comprehensive, evidence-based treatment services.

Job Resources

We're providing even more resources for skill set enhancement, resume building, and job acquisition. We've also implemented a job training partnership with Worknet DuPage.

Facilities

With strong partnerships in the community, we upgraded our main campus and multiple recovery homes to allow our patients to feel even more comfortable and confident.

Van

Our new 12-passenger van helps clients get to and from work, enjoy off-site excursions, and connect at sober, fun events.

Veterans

Serenity partners with corporations, sponsors, donors, employees, and community supporters to empower veterans to rebuild their lives by providing access to substance abuse treatment, jobs, job training, and housing to restore their pride and purpose.

Program Enhancements

We now offer a parenting program, an art program, and SMART recovery, with plans for future adolescent educational programs in the works.


